
AFFIDAVIT OF CHARLES BILLINGS

I, Charles Billings, make this affidavit under penalties of perjury:

1. I am a resident of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, and am over twenty-one years of age. I make this affidavit based on my personal recollection of events at the agency of Maryland State government now known as the Department of Business and Economic Development ("DBED"), where I am Managing Director of Administrative Services overseeing the administrative functions for DBED including Human Resources for DBED.
2. David M. Robinson was employed by DBED (then known as the Department of Economic and Employment Development) during a time that I handled personnel matters for the Department.
3. While the written records in Mr. Robinson's personnel file at DBED, which I reviewed today, contain a letter of resignation from Mr. Robinson and state that he resigned, I have a clear recollection that Mr. Robinson resigned after being told by the Department's Secretary, J. Randall Evans, that he would be terminated if he did not immediately resign.
4. My clear recollection is that Secretary Evans told me that he had called Mr. Robinson to a meeting at which only he and Mr. Robinson were present, to advise him that based on serious and credible allegations of criminal conduct which involved asking for fees for his services as a State employee which should have been without cost, Secretary Evans would immediately terminate Mr. Robinson if Mr. Robinson did not instead resign immediately, and that Mr. Robinson chose to resign.

I solemnly affirm under the penalties of perjury and upon personal knowledge that the contents of the foregoing paper are true to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
